NOW COMES DAVID A. GANN and ELIZABETH D. GANN, Plaintiffs in the above-captioned action, and by this document does create and give notice of a Lis Pendens affecting title to that property which is in part the subject of this action, as is more specifically described on Exhibit A attached hereto, and the undersigned gives notice to all concerned parties and to the Court as follows:

- 1. A civil action was commenced before the Superior Court of Henderson County, North Carolina, as above captioned. The Plaintiffs in this action have raised the issue of title to a Right of Way and appurtenant easements created by express instrument of record in favor of Plaintiffs, which rights are being disputed by the Defendants.
