
NAME CHANGE/A G MARKETING INC

RENEWAL OF PROSPECTING LICENCES  
LVB 3334 A/90  
LVB 2103 A/91

We hereby beg to apply for a renewal of the above licences when their current terms run out.

We have in a previous correspondence informed you of the restructuring of this company to achieve viability as the previous shareholders were financially handicapped and could not undertake any satisfactory prospecting activity. As a result of a financing deal concluded with Messrs Norcan Resources Ltd a reputable Canadian Mining Company, Vista has sold out its interests and control. Therefore the prospecting activities in Ghana of Vista Mining Corporation are now owned and controlled by Norcan Resources Ltd, backed by AMI Resources Ltd both of Canada. These two organisations with their extensive mining experience and sound financial capabilities are presently in the Vista prospecting area in Ghana and are committed to carrying out satisfactory exploration activity.

We attach herewith the First Phase of the Ghana Prospecting Budget/Work Plan as from January 1996 for your information. We also attach the First Quarter Prospecting Return for your attention. We only started field work in the last week of March 1996 as our arrival in Ghana was very much delayed because we had to comply with certain Vancouver Stock Exchange requirements.

These issues have now been cleared and prospecting work is now proceeding satisfactorily and in accordance with our Work Plan. This will be reflected in our next quarter returns.

Our prospecting activities encompass the entire existing licenced area. We realise that in the next renewal we will have to shed off 50% of this area. However the history of the activities of Vista over the years, and the record of successive renewals and shed offs during this period point to the fact that losing further grounds would result in our holding on to an area too small to be economically viable to prospect on. Having regard to the fact that we are currently having to expend large sums of money on exploration in an area likely to be shed off in a couple of months, we intend to put in an application in the name of Messrs Norcan Mining Corporation now being registered in Ghana, to take up the shed of area which when added to the new licence area, will enable us carry on a meaningful exploration programme.




